STATE ISSUE 1

Proposed Constitutional Amendment
(Proposed by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly of Ohio)

To amend Sections 1a, 1b, 1c, and 1g of Article II of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to provide for earlier filing deadlines for statewide ballot issues.

A majority yes vote is necessary for passage.

STATE ISSUE 2

Proposed Constitutional Amendment

(Proposed by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly of Ohio)

To adopt Section 2q of Article VIII of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to authorize the state to issue bonds to continue the Clean Ohio Program for environmental revitalization and conservation.

A majority yes vote is necessary for passage.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment

(Proposed by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly of Ohio)

To adopt Section 19b of Article 1 of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to protect the private property rights in ground water, lakes and other watercourses.

A majority yes vote is necessary for passage.

A majority yes vote is necessary for passage.

STATE ISSUE 6
Proposed Constitutional Amendment
(Proposed by Initiative Petition)

To adopt Section 6a to Article XV of the Ohio Constitution to authorize a casino near Wilmington, Ohio in southwest Ohio and distribute to all Ohio counties a tax on the casino.

A majority yes vote is necessary for passage.


