Apply to be a Precinct
Election Official in Ohio

- Get a front row seat to democracy on Election Day by staffing a polling place
- Do your part for your country, state and local community
- Earn extra spending money in the process

Who can participate?

You can qualify to serve as a precinct election official (P.E.O.) in Ohio if you meet the following requirements:

- You are a U.S. citizen.
- You are at least 17 years old, will be 18 by Election Day and are registered to vote.
- You are a resident of the county in which you want to serve.
- You are not running as a candidate for the election in which you are working.
- You have not been convicted of a felony.

Make it a school project!

Schools may also contact the county board of elections to establish a student P.E.O. program.

Why participate?

- Earn more than \$100 for the day in most counties.
- Include experience on job resumes and college applications.
- Gain a better understanding of the election and voting process.
- Serve your community and help democracy work by making sure every eligible voter can vote.
