## To be a precinct election official in Ohio, you must meet the following requirements:

- You must be at least 17 years of age and a registered voter.
- You must be registered to vote in the county you plan to work as a precinct election official
  - You have not been convicted of a felony (unless the conviction has been reversed, expunged or pardoned).

Also:

- You will need to have transportation to and from the polls.
- You cannot be running as a candidate for the election in which you are working.
- You will need to attend a training session.
- You will need to work from about 5:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.\*
